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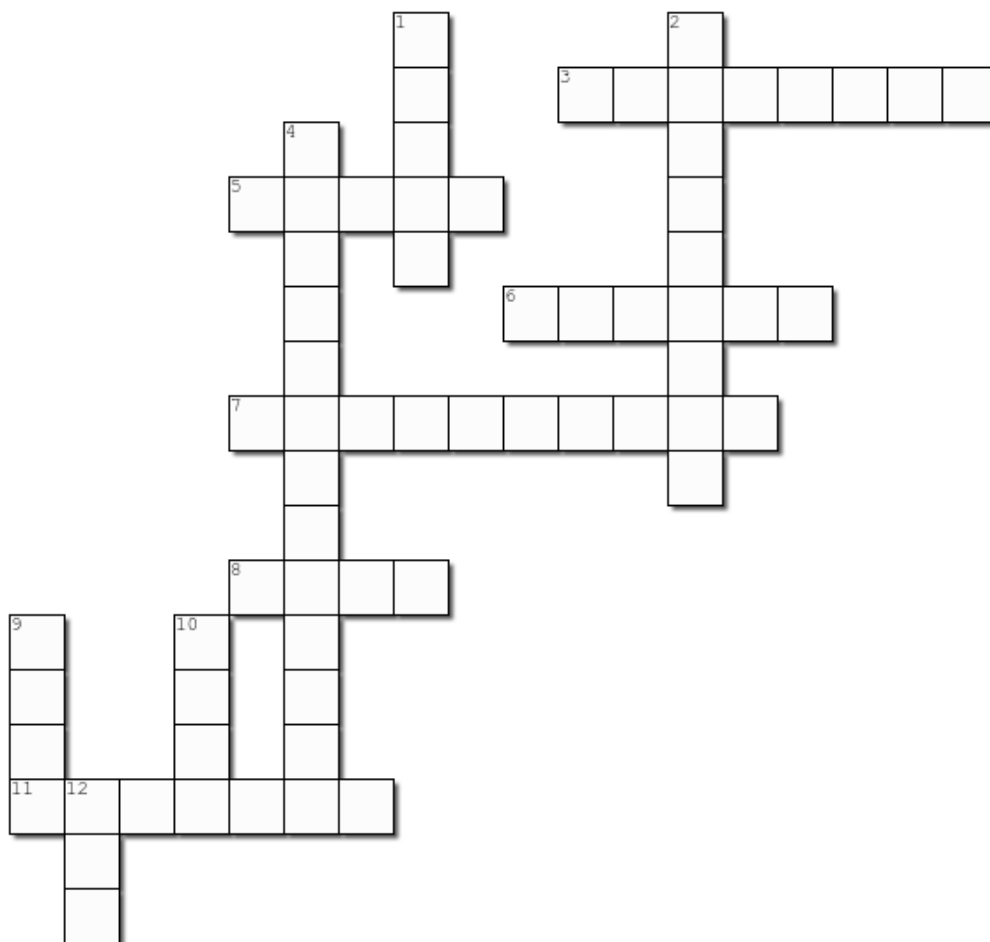

Buddy Chat BINGO

(You will need six counters per child in addition to the descriptions and the bingo cards).

The teacher gives out one bingo card per child. The teacher will then choose from the descriptions below and read this to the class. If a child has the word on their card which corresponds to the description read out, they can cover that word with a counter. Once a child has covered all their words, they shout BINGO! The teacher should verify that all the words are correct. The first child to do this successfully is the winner.

Descriptions:

- **Thinking** - We do this with our brains.
- **Words** - We say and write these.
- **Sounds** - We hear these with our ears.
- **Understand** - When we get what someone is telling us.
- **Wait** - Giving each other time to talk and listen.
- **Talking** - Another word for chatting.
- **Buddy** - Another word for a friend.
- **Listening** - When we stay quiet and use our ears to hear the words the other person is saying.
- **Communication** - How we tell people things and how we listen and understand what people say to us.
- **Chat** - Another word for talk.

Buddy Chat Communication Game

You will need:

- Building blocks (for example, Lego).
- Dividers (for example, a large hard-back library book - one per pair).

Pupils will work in pairs with a divider between them and label themselves pupil 1 and pupil 2. Pupil 1 and pupil 2 should have exactly the same building blocks. Pupil 1 will build something using the building blocks. Pupil 2 should not see this. Pupil 1 will then describe to pupil 2 how to build their creation. Pupil 2 will follow pupil 1's instructions, aiming to replicate pupil 1's creation. At the end, remove the divider to check if the two creations are exactly the same.

The teacher may ask some of the questions below as a follow-up:

- How did you find this activity? Was it easy, tricky etc?
- Were your creations exactly the same/similar at the end?
- How did you describe your creation to your partner?
- Do you think you did a good job describing/Do you think your partner did a good job describing? Why?
- Do you think you did a good job listening?/Do you think your partner did a good job listening? Why?
- Is there anything you would do differently next time?



Buddy Chat High 5 Poster

You will need:

- Blank sheets of paper.
- Coloured pencils and pens.

Start by recapping what makes up the Buddy Chat High 5 and how these things are needed to create good communication between each other.

To illustrate the Buddy Chat High 5, the children can create a poster by firstly drawing around their hand. They can then write the parts of the High 5 on their fingers and draw pictures for each.



Buddy Chat SLAM Poem

Just like the Buddy Chat rhyme, children can create their own poem.

The teacher should give the children a large sheet of paper to each group (of around 4 children) where the pupils can brainstorm ideas and words they want to include in their poem (see Buddy Chat word bank below for starting points). This can be made into an acrostic poem, a rhyme or a rap - it is up to the group/teacher.

Children can then perform their poem freely as a group in front of the rest of the class as a fun activity.
